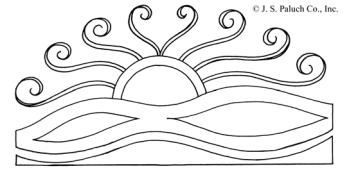

Many of our homeless do not have ready access to fresh water. A case of bottled water will go a long way in helping them cope with the intense heat of July and August. CATHOLIC SCHOOLS AND PARISHIONERS – If a family contributes here according to their ability, then this parish will contribute the differential between in-parish and out-of-parish Catholic rates to the Catholic school of their choice in synch with its tuition system. The point is that the family belongs HERE and should participate fully in weekly Mass and all programs, including religious education, HERE. If a family chooses to educate their children at a Catholic school, great. That family should not suffer a financial penalty for doing so as members of this parish. It should not have to leave this parish family to do so. The non-Catholics who take advantage of a good Catholic education do not leave their home-churches. The differential in tuition charged by a school to families who do not belong to its parish is legitimate if those who are charged the in-parish rate are required to contribute according to their ability to its parish. ANointing OF THE SICK –This sacrament, along with penance and Holy Communion, is available to anyone over the age of reason (nearing 7 yrs. old), Call 445-2497 x 5, 24/7/365 if you

have an urgent need. Even if you are not seriously ill, please call 445-2497 x 14 to let us know when you are hospitalized or confined to home (pew envelopes are another way to let us know). Receive anointing if you know you will be having serious tests or surgery or if you are growing weak with age, struggling with mental illness or addiction. Please ask for the sacrament the weekend before a medical procedure. For children under seven, they should be baptized and the special blessing for sick children is administered. Viaticum is the sacrament of the dying and, if possible, Holy Communion in this form should be offered to them often. Please contact a priest when someone has died so that he may assist the family in their grief. Remember, anyone can baptize in danger of death. Call 445-2497 x 5 at any time you have an urgent need.
