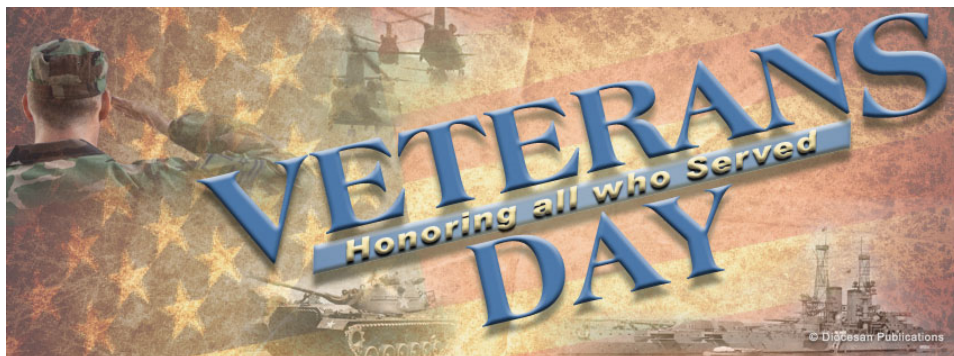

NOVENA FOR THE SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING On the last Sunday of each liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, or Christ the King. November 11-19, the nine days

preceding the Solemnity, the USCCB encourages Catholics to participate in a Novena to Christ the King. Let us take this time to offer prayers to our sovereign king for the freedom of the Church.

REFLECTION FROM OUR SEMINARIAN We hear today from St. Paul the importance of work. Work can take many forms and prayer itself can also be considered a form of work, that is the work of God. Note though, that St. Paul is not against rest and leisure, as he speaks of the importance of rest in his other letters. However, to have a proper understanding of why we need to work as a means to help our spiritual life, we need to understand the dangers that idleness gives to our spiritual life and what proper leisure actually is. St. Peter wrote in his first letter: “Stay sober and alert. Your opponent the devil is prowling like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour” (1 Peter 5:8). When we fall into idleness, we open ourselves up to temptations and we seek to replace God with other things, oftentimes with pleasure. Then we grow slack in prayer and the practice of virtue. This is known as the sin of sloth. So, it is important to keep active to avoid falling into sloth. In our free time (since we can’t be expected to always work) it is important to try and participate in restorative leisure, which uplifts the soul and restores us. Examples of restorative leisure would be prayer, reading spiritual readings or the classics, listening to uplifting music, and spending time with family and friends. Pleasure can be a part of this, but it, as with all things, must be tempered. It is important for us to endure in our work and in the work of God, lest we slip back into sinful ways. – Matthew Bonner

ANOINTING OF THE SICK This sacrament, along with penance and Holy Communion, is available to anyone over the age of reason (nearing 7 yrs. old), Call 445.2497x5, 24/7/365 if you have an urgent need. Even if you are not seriously ill, please call 445.2497x14 to let us know when you are hospitalized or confined to home (pew envelopes are another way to let us know). Receive anointing if you know you will be having serious tests or surgery or if you are growing weak with age, struggling with mental illness or addiction. Please ask for the sacrament the weekend before a medical procedure. For children under seven, they should be baptized and the special blessing for sick children is administered. Viaticum is the sacrament of the dying and, if possible, Holy Communion in this form should be offered to them often. Please contact a clergyman when someone has died so that he may assist the family in their grief. Remember, anyone can baptize in danger of death.
