

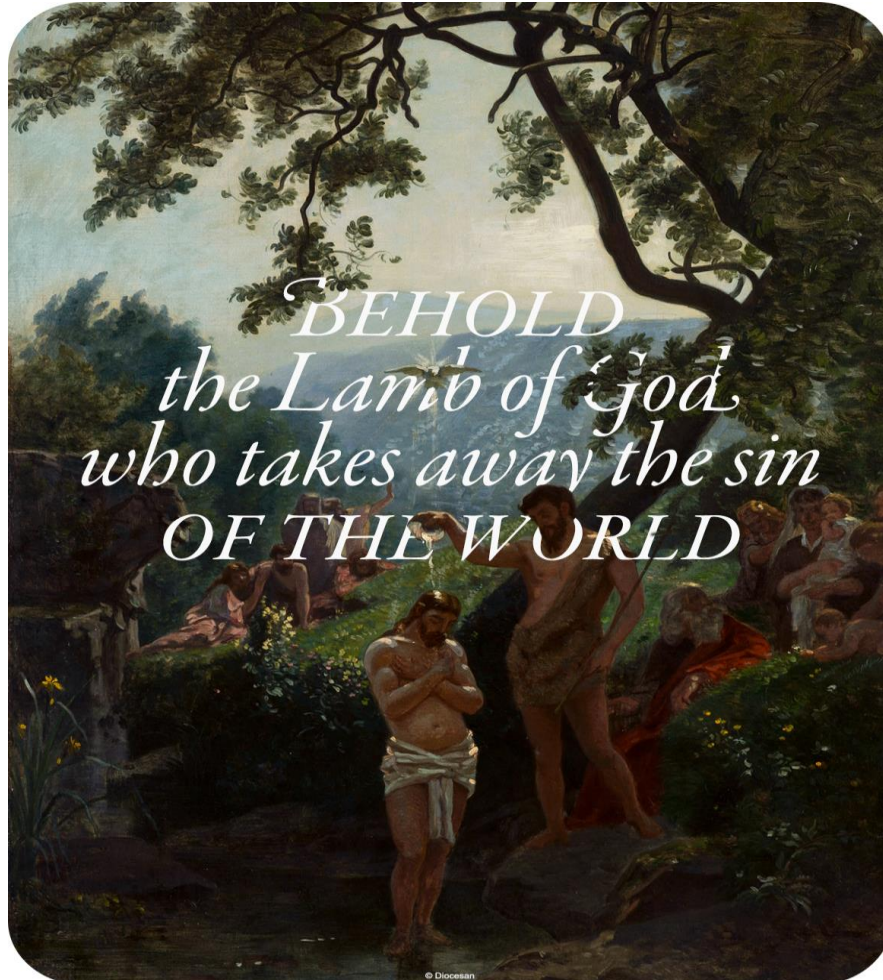

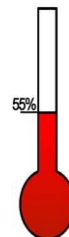

AIRCONDITION FUND RAISING CAMPAIGNE FOR ACTIVITIES BUILDING:

We recently received approval from Bishop Marshall to begin fund raising to replace the two A/C units in the Activities Building. One of the two units is not repairable; the other unit is showing severe signs of distress. The replacement cost of the two units is projected at \$85,000. Our AC fund currently has a total of \$51,475.18. We plan to use \$45,000 towards the project keeping only a minimal balance in the account for repairs on other building units as the need may arise and often does. An additional \$40,000 will need to be raised this year hopefully by summer in-order-to minimize the downtime use of the building. We are asking all our parishioners and business owners to help raise money by giving generously to the 2026 AC Capital Campaign for Activity Bldg. Please be sure to clearly mark your checks and pew envelopes accordingly for bookkeeping purposes. Thank you in advance for your support.







NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE LEGAL PROTECTION OF UNBORN CHILDREN – JANUARY 22 The General Instruction of the Roman Missal, no. 373, designates January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the “Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children”: “In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance

for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion.”

BAPTISM (under age of 7)

Baptisms are typically celebrated around weekend mass times.
At least one Godparent must be an active-practicing catholic and provide documentation of their completed sacraments – baptism to confirmation.
Godparent(s) also need to submit a signed Certificate of Sponsorship from their home parish priest.

MARRIAGE

Please contact our Priest before setting a wedding date.
All couples must complete formation meetings prior to nuptial celebration.

For those who use Rapides Regional Medical Center: A small reminder for all our Catholics who may be admitted to Rapides Regional Medical Center in Alexandria. Sometimes when going through admitting, the hospital worker may neglect to ask for the patient's religious affiliation. The result is the patient is not listed on the roster as Catholic and the hospital's Catholic ministry team is unaware that you are in the hospital. Please try to remember to mention this during the admitting procedure. Thank you – Fr. Jason Gootee, Chaplain at Rapides Regional Medical Center

ANOIDING OF THE SICK

This sacrament, along with penance and Holy Communion, is available to anyone over the age of reason (nearing 7 yrs. old).
For Children under the age seven, they should be baptized and the special blessing for sick children is administered.
Viaticum is the sacrament of the dying and, if possible, Holy Communion in this form should be offered to them often.

SERIOUS ILLNESS: Please receive anointing if you know you will be having serious tests or surgery, or if you are growing weak with age, struggling with mental illness or addiction.

NON-SERIOUS ILLNESSES: Please ask for the sacrament the weekend before a medical procedure.

Please contact a clergyman when someone has died so that a Priest may assist the family in their grief. Remember, anyone can baptize with water in danger of death.

HOSPITALIZATION

Please let us know ASAP when you are hospitalized (give patient's name, room number, and hospital) or when you are discharged/confined to home, or when transferred to a Rehabilitation hospital.

FUNERALS

Services are scheduled by the funeral home representative directly with the Pastor. While you are meeting at the funeral home, have the funeral director call the pastor personally.
